



CENTRAL STREET RESIDENCY APPLICATION

What is "The One-Eighty Residency?"

The One-Eighty Residency Program is a one-year, intensive internship program designed to give you a comprehensive introduction to mission, theology, and practical life. Through formal and informal gatherings and practices, our residents will learn how to live life with others in a dorm setting, see the beauty in cross-cultural living, learn how God is already working in and through them, and practice rhythms that will keep them grounded throughout their year together. Through this program residents will receive:

- 54 accredited academic units through Kairos University (upon successful completion of program)
- Full room and board at the Central Street Residence
- A full year of deep spiritual formation in close community
- A broad understanding of contextual theology & missiology
- Experience in youth ministry & programming
- Experience in outdoor education & adventure programming
- Experience in adolescent mental health
- Experience in community development
- A front-row seat to see how God is working in a small community through counselors, guides, mentors, and neighbors.

What exactly will our residents do?

Our one year residency program will give our residents hands-on experience with each of the branches of One-Eighty. As a part of our **Community** team, they will live intentionally, working with kids and families to bring peace and hope to the neighborhood they will call home. At the **Teen Center**, they will build impactful mentoring relationships with teens while being trained to make café drinks, use the sound system, and shoot a mean game of pool. Residents will have the opportunity to pitch tents, encourage students on the trail, and roast marshmallows around a campfire on **Adventures Trips**. Finally, Residents will learn how to respond to mental health crises, show compassion to students and families who are struggling, and learn basic counseling skills with **Counseling & Resources**.

Their weeks will include:

- Daily rhythms of spiritual formation, including the "daily office," shared meals, and practices of prayer and devotion
- Staff meetings with different Program Directors for training and planning
- Weekly readings and classes with leaders, directors, and mentors
- Regular program hours at one of the One-Eighty Program sites (Teen Center, Horizon, Hale Park, Woodbridge, etc.)
- Monthly meals with neighbors (both hosted at the Central House and in homes of neighbors)

Requirements and Application Process

Prospective residents must meet the following minimum criteria:

- Have an active, vibrant relationship with Jesus Christ, and be a part of a Christian fellowship
- Be a high school graduate under 22 years of age, with a minimum 2.5 GPA
- Pass a background check
- Submit your full application and essay, available online at 180lodi.org
- Complete a DISC Assessment
- Complete Informal conversation with Resident Director
- Complete Formal Interview with One-Eighty Staff

So in 500 words, dig deep for a few moments and be as honest as you can about your experiences with God, the church, and ministry. Include struggles, doubts, things you are learning, desires, and dreams. Tell us not about what you are doing, but about *who you are becoming*, the good stuff and the bad stuff. Tell us about what you are hoping for these days and what you might be afraid of.
